Traits of a good friend

- 1. Shared Hope in the Gospel-this must be the foundation of any good relationship

- 2. Unconditional Love-The love in 1 Corinthians is not talking about marriage even though it can certainly be applied to it

- 3. Realistic Expectations-We are all flawed and should be understanding of that fact
 - a. 1 John 1:8
 - b. Colossians 3:12-13
- 4. Family Commitment—we are family in Christ
 - a. John 1:12
 - b. 2 Corinthians 6:18
 - c. Galatians 6:10
- 5. Heart of Edification—good friends build each other up not tear each other down
 - a. 1 Thessalonians 6:9-11
 - b. Ephesians 4:29
- 6. Gentle Admonition—we are to lovingly correct and be open to correction from our brothers and sisters in Christ
 - a. Galatians 6:1
 - b. Proverbs 27:5-6
 - c. Proverbs 27:17
- 7. Boundaries—avoid the temptation to be like this world—hold each other accountable
 - a. Proverbs 16:28
 - b. Psalm 141:3
 - c. Philippians 4:8

Types of bad friends

- 1. The tells you what you want to hear friend
 - a. Psalm 55:21
 - b. Proverbs 27:5-6
- 2. The not that serious about God friend
 - a. Matthew 22:37
 - b. Psalm 62:8
 - c. Amo 3:3
- 3. The complacent-no ambition-lazy friend
 - a. Colossians 3:23
 - b. Proverbs 26:13-16
- 4. The attention must be on me friend
 - a. John 3:30
- 5. The everyone else is doing it friend
 - a. Psalm 1:1-2
 - b. Proverbs 12:26
 - c. Romans 12:2
- 6. The pessimist-see the bad in everything-friend
 - a. Philippians 4:4-7
 - b. John 16:33
- 7. The unforgiving friend
 - a. Ephesians 4:32
 - b. Matthew 18:21-22
 - c. Matthew 6:14

These are just a few of the things God's Word has to say about non-romantic relationships, or friendships. It is by no means an all-inclusive list. However, I would venture to say, if you stuck strictly by these qualifications when determining if a friend is good or bad, I think your answer would be pretty accurate.

Recognizing these traits can be tricky. Our judgement is often impaired by our environment and/or our own struggles and hang-ups. It is vital that we use God's Word as our qualifications for any relationship.

Making, maintaining, and knowing when to let go of friendships can be a tricky task but these decisions have an enormous impact on our lives and how we live or don't live for Christ.
